

MSU C4I Postdoc Dr. Edgar Cardenas directed a new video on the Detroit Partnership for Food, Learning and Innovation (DPFLI)!

The MSU Detroit Partnership for Food, Learning and Innovation broke ground in the first half of 2018 at the site of the former Houghten Elementary School in the Riverdale neighborhood, near Brightmoor. Urban-focused research areas envisioned for the center include soil sampling and pollution cleanup, pest and crop disease management, forestry, innovative growing systems and community food systems development.

## Job Opening: Postdoctoral Research Associate

The Postdoctoral Research Associate will join a collaborative, interdisciplinary NSF-funded research team examining the role of an inclusive climate in academic STEM on career outcomes and attitudes of underrepresented scholars (Broadening Participation of Underrepresented Scholars in Academic STEM: The Influence of an Inclusive Climate on Early-Career Outcomes). This research is being conducted jointly by Drs. Kendra Spence Cheruvelil (Department of Fisheries and Wildlife and the Lyman Briggs College), Kevin Elliott (Departments of Fisheries and Wildlife, Philosophy, and the Lyman Briggs College), and Georgina Montgomery (Department of History and the Lyman Briggs College), as well as scholars at the University of Michigan (UM; Dr. Isis Settles in the Departments of Psychology, Afroamerican and African Studies, and Women and Gender Studies and Dr. Erin Cech in the Department of Sociology) (https://eestem.weebly.com/). 


