Announcing the West Michigan Sustainable Business Forum Webinar: Cost and Considerations of the COVID-19 Environmental "Silver Lining"

Interested in perspectives on sustainability and COVID-19? Join C4I Postdoc Dr. Edgar Cardenas at the following (free) online roundtable this Wednesday!

On April 1, from 12-1PM EST, the West Michigan Sustainable Business Forum will host an online roundtable examining the so-called environmental "silver lining" of the Covid-19 pandemic. There is an emerging consensus that actions taken to reduce viral transmission will lead to significant temporary reductions in greenhouse gas reductions and noticeable improvements in environmental conditions in certain regions and industries.

While it believed these temporary reductions may demonstrate the possibility for mankind to respond to global issues such as climate change, they have come within significant ethical concerns, economic challenges and disproportionate impacts. This roundtable will unpack how sustainability practitioners and stakeholders might interpret these issues as they work to promote sustainability and equity in their organizations, industries, and communities.
